Community Fellowship – Shrove Tuesday Free Pancake and Sausage dinner will be March 4th 5-7, Lunch with the Bunny will be Saturday April 5th 12pm, and Cinco de Mayo Buffet will be Monday May 4th, 5:30-7:30 (Quatro de Mayo because of scheduling issue)

Finance – showed levels of gifts in 2024 and discussion followed for notification and thank yous from the Financial Secretary and it was decided that they were unnecessary and a security risk if done by anyone else. They are part of the annual financial statements and information on them is available to the donor from the Financial Secretary.

Fellowship – Aiding with Shrove Tuesday and Wednesday Soup & Sandwich during Lent

Rocking Horse Preschool – Registration has begun for 2025/26 school year. Marketing and recruiting discussed. First Aid Certification for teachers is scheduled, State Certification application submitted. Audit is scheduled. Update of RHPS Board Handbook is being revisited.

Worship & Music – Ash Wednesday is March 5th at 7:00; Lenten Soup & Sandwich begins March 12 at 6:00 with service at 7:00. Theme will be a different biblical person whose life was changed by Christ every Wednesday. For Holy Week, Taize Service will be April 16th, Maundy Thursday April 17th, Good Friday April 18th all at 7:00. Easter Services- Sunrise Service is at sunrise and Easter Service is at 10:30 with Easter Breakfast between the services. There will still be a Saturday Evening Service at 5:30

Old Business

Church Council Roster distributed and checked. A Donahue appointed Evangelism Liaison

A new **church directory** was discussed and tabled until our 70th Anniversary or progress is made on achieving a shared pastor

20 Letters to select local congregations concerning **sharing a pastor** were revised showing new officers, reviewed and signed by president and sent Feb 10^{th}

Moving of **34 inactive units** from the active to inactive rosters was discussed. Motion to make this move was made by J Stewart, seconded and approved

New Business

The **female troop of the Scouts** request to have an overnight at the church was discussed and restrictions and parameters were discussed. Motion to waive the \$150 hall use fee, but keep the \$25 sexton fee and \$50 refundable security fee was made by J Stewart, seconded and approved

The **submission of articles** recognizing persons or events within the church submitted by church members and their publication in the newsletter was discussed at length and it was decided to examine these on an individual basis to determine if they would be published. It was agreed the length could not be longer than a page, (which is a half sheet), permission from the family or individual being recognized must be obtained, they should be submitted in a timely manner and the article will be printed under the submitter's name.

A **council retreat** will be held May 3rd for Congregation Council and Congregation Officers.

Renumbering of envelopes to lessen the number of envelopes ordered saving the church money and decreasing waste. The new numbers will go into effect for 2026 but envelopes should be ordered by the end of February. Motion to this effect made by J Luffy, seconded and approved

Good Shepherd gets two voting representatives to **Synod Assembly** but can send more. Three names were discussed as interested in going. Order of business at the assembly will include electing a new bishop.

Getting a lapel or ear-piece **microphon**e that is compatible with the Social Room sound system was referred to Property who will investigate options

Ash Wednesday Service – March 5 – 7:00 pm

Each year, Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter with a day of

prayer and repentance. Marking our foreheads with ashes, we acknowledge that we die and return to the earth. At the same time, the ashes trace the life-giving cross of Jesus Christ indelibly marked on our foreheads at baptism. It is a time of reflection and renewal, as we recommit ourselves to living our lives as believers and followers of Jesus.

The service consists of both the receiving of ashes, as a sign of repentance, and holy communion, as a sign of Jesus coming again into our lives.

Wednesday Evening Soup Dinners and Mid-Week Lenten Services

Christians have celebrated the 40-day season of Lent since the early times of the church. It is a time to take a deep dive into the stories of Jesus and his ministry and teachings. This Lent, the Mid-Week Services focus on the stories of five people whose lives were changed by their encounter with Jesus. Each service will contain prayers, Bible readings, hymns, and a dramatic monologue from each of the five persons. The services begin at **7:00 pm**, and are about thirty minutes long and reflective in nature.

The five stories are:

March 12	Jesus Goes to Zaccheus House
March 19	Jesus Heals a Man Overcome with Evil Spirits
March 26	Jesus Teaches the Rabbi (Teacher) Nicodemus
April 2	Jesus Touches and Heals a Man
April 9	A Roman Army Officer Comes to Faith

Each service will be preceded by at **6:00 pm** with a community soup and sandwich dinner, (bring your own sandwich) hosted by a church group.



Wonder about what makes Luke's gospel special?

Then come to the bible study lead by Pastor Ed on the first and third Sunday of

the month, at 9:30 am. Luke, like the other three gospel writers, had his own particular take on the life of Jesus, and its meaning. The class is informal, and the discussion often takes the class all over the lot with questions about the bible, what we believe, and how to live it out in everyday life.

Election of a New Bishop of the Synod in June

Our synod will elect a new bishop in June 2025, as Bishop Kusserow is retiring. The bishop who is elected will serve a sixyear term. The Bishop provides leadership, oversight, and spiritual guidance for both the pastors and congregations in the synod. Discernment and hearing the call of the Holy Spirit for the right person to be elected as the bishop is something that happens both as individuals and communally.
